MISSION

The GSSA's mission is to promote and facilitate interest and research in genealogy and family history.

JOURNALS AND NEWSLETTERS

- ✓ The GSSA publishes the quarterly journal *FAMILIA* that contains a variety of articles covering all facets of genealogical research.
- ✓ *Capensis* and *Genesis* are genealogical journals published by the Western Cape and eGGSA branches respectively.
- ✓ Various newsletters are published by regional branches.

COMPUTER PROGRAM

Gen2SA is a public domain computer program developed by GSSA members that converts and indexes genealogical information obtained from various commercially available computer programs, into the standard South African genealogical format (viz a1b2c3d5).

RESEARCH AND ADVICE

- ✓ GSSA does not undertake *formal research*, but in excess of 800 enquiries are directed annually to volunteer or commercial researchers.
- ✓ Through its national network of members as well as contacts with archival institutions and national and international genealogical sources, the GSSA can provide valuable *advice and support to researchers* and family members on their projects.
- ✓ The GSSA sets *standards and guidelines* for genealogical activities, including the publication of genealogical products.
- ✓ The GSSA, through its members, branches and other contacts, undertakes *technological research* to stay abreast of information technology, archiving and record keeping techniques, copyright and legal issues as these matters relate to genealogical research.

GENEALOGICAL SOURCES

- ✓ The GSSA maintains active contact with most archival institutions in South Africa and many international research organisations in order to promote and facilitate genealogical research.
- ✓ The *Sources Preservation Project* promotes the preservation of source material of interest to genealogists and other researchers such as historians and geneticists.

LIBRARY

The GSSA maintains a library of books and electronic source material of genealogical interest distributed among the regional branches.

RESEARCHERS

A list of commercial researchers is available on the GSSA website.

TRAINING

- ✓ Regional branches periodically offer training courses on genealogical research, record keeping, publications, computer technology and related topics.
- ✓ The GSSA encourages the recognition of the study of genealogy as an academic pursuit.
- ✓ Periodic visits to archival institutions and other places of genealogical interest are arranged.

CONFERENCES AND AWARDS

- ✓ The GSSA organises and participates in conferences related to matters of genealogical interest.
- ✓ The GSSA annually presents *Awards of Merit* in order to recognise and encourage genealogical research and service of high quality.

AFFILIATIONS & COOPERATION

The GSSA has formal affiliations with and cooperates with a variety of organisations of importance to genealogical research, such as:

REKENAARPROGRAM

Gen2SA is 'n rekenaarprogram in die openbare domein wat deur GGSA-lede ontwikkel is en die genealogiese inligting afkomstig van kommersiële rekenaarprogramme indekseer en omskakel en na die standaard formaat vir Suid-Afrikaanse genealogieë (nl. a1b2c3d5 waar die letter die spesifieke generasie/geslag en die syfer die posisie van persoon binne gesin aandui).

NAVORSING EN ADVIES

- ✓ Die GGSA onderneem nie *formele navorsing* nie maar verwys jaarliks meer as 800 navrae na vrywillige of kommersiële navorsers.
- ✓ Deur sy nasionale netwerk van lede en kontakte met argivale instellings en nasionale en internasionale genealogiese bronne, kan die GGSA waardevolle *inligting en steun* aan navorsers en familielede oor hulle projekte verleen.
- ✓ Die GGSA stel *standaarde en riglyne* op vir genealogiese aktiwiteite, insluitend die publikasie van genealogiese produkte.
- ✓ Deur sy lede, takke en ander verbindings onderneem die GGSA *tegnologiese navorsing* om tred te hou met informasietegnologie, argivering en rekordhouding, kopiëreg en regsaspekte wat vir genealogiese navorsing van belang is.

GENEALOGIESE BRONNE

- ✓ Die GGSA behou noue kontak met die meeste argivale instellings in Suid-Afrika en baie internasionale navorsingsorganisasies ten einde genealogiese navorsing te bevorder.
- ✓ Die *Bronnebewaringsprojek* bevorder die bewaring van bronmateriaal van belang vir genealoë en ander navorsers, soos historici en genetici.

BIBLIOTEEK

Die GGSA beskik oor 'n versameling boeke en elektroniese bronmateriaal van genealogiese belang wat by onderskeie takke gehuisves word.

NAVORSERS

'n Lys kommersiële navorsers is op die GGSA-webwerf beskikbaar.

OPLEIDING

- ✓ Die onderskeie takke bied gereeld opleidingskursusse oor genealogiese navorsing, rekordhouding, publikasies, rekenartegnologie en verwante onderwerpe aan.
- ✓ Die GGSA poog om genealogiese studies as 'n akademiese dissipline te bevorder.
- ✓ Besoeke aan die argiewe en ander argivale instellings word gereël.

KONFERENSIES EN TOEKENNINGS

- ✓ Die GGSA reël en neem deel aan konferensies wat met genealogiese sake verband hou.
- ✓ Die GGSA maak jaarliks verskeie merietetoeëennings om erkenning en ondersteuning te verleen aan uitnemende genealogiese navorsing en diens.
